## 265 MILE RIDE FOR BREAST CANCER ENDS AT BIRD'S HILL PARK SATURDAY

Trail's End Celebration Saturday features concert & pig roast



265 miles. 22 days. 28 communities. And it all comes to an end Saturday at Bird's Hill Park as part of the [2011 Manitoba Equestrian Championships](#).

Horse lovers and riding enthusiasts hit the trail September 10<sup>th</sup> for three weeks on horseback in the inaugural [Manitoba Wild Pink Yonder](#) trail ride to raise funds for breast cancer research.

The ride began in Morden and over the next 22 days meandered through southern Manitoba, stopping at 28 communities; a 265 mile ride that culminates at Bird's Hill Park on Saturday, October 1<sup>st</sup> for the Trail's End Wind-Up Dinner and Social.

The final day's ride begins in **Dugald** (Hwy 15/206) and continues through **Oak Bank** and into Bird's Hill Provincial park where the riders are expected to arrive at the [Bird's Hill Park Ranch](#)/Manitoba Horse Council Equestrian Facility at about 4:00 PM on Saturday.

The Trail's End celebration begins at 6:00 PM is expected to be sold out, due in large part because of the entertainment, Manitoba's [Two Dollar Pistol](#).

"Our goal was to raise money for breast cancer research," says organizer Pam Glover "with the final goal to find a cure for breast cancer."

"Over the past three years we have raised over a quarter of a million dollars for breast cancer research," says Alberta Trail Boss Jane Hurl "and this year we welcomed Manitoba for the first time."
